**Where WIA Workers Live**

- An estimated 104,677 primary wage and salary jobs were located in the Western Maryland WIA (Allegany, Garrett and Washington counties) in 2010.
- About 54% of workers staffing these positions resided in the tri-county area.
- In-commuters accounted for about a fourth of the WIA's workers. The largest worker supply came from Pennsylvania.
